Dear Sir

I have not hitherto been able to procure the Actes relative to your affair with Mr Morgan but am shortly promised them, and shall then write you further. Argote denies having ever received any thing on account of the Business and is I believe now employed by Morgan in assisting him in his other affairs and therefore will not be molested - Morgan informs me that the Mortgage given by Argote was declared null & void by Seneca, but he had no authority to do this extrajudicially and after seeing the Papers I shall be better able to judge, it is a flat contradiction of what Argote asserts that he had no Interest, that he should have given this Mortgage to Morgan's Attorneys, ought to have insisted on its validity - Morgan further informs me

that when he was last here if you were called to  
acknowledge your signature to the Bond  
you confessed you justly owed this money, but  
pleading inability to pay the matter was there-  
fore stopped. A Mr. John Clay will in  
all probability be sent home next month  
to watch in this of other Business of Mayors,  
and I presume will have orders to commence  
a suit against you - In a few days I  
shall write you more particularly & remain
