## (COURT CALLED TO ORDER)

THE COURT: Good morning. Let's call the case,
please.
THE DEPUTY CLERK: MDL-2047, In re:
Chinese-Manufactured Drywal1 Products Liability Litigation.
THE COURT: Liaison counsel, make their appearance for the record.

MR. LEVIN: Good morning, Your Honor. Arnold Levin for plaintiffs' liaison counsel, Russ Herman, who is either on top of a pyramid or a camel right now. We don't know which, but we can be assured that it's one or the other.

THE COURT: Well, he helped build the pyramids, so he's entitled to it.

MR. LEVIN: What I'm afraid of is that he's in Egypt and some pharaoh is going to give him some hot coal to taste.

MR. ROSENBERG: Your Honor, I'm not going to touch where Mr. Herman is or who he's on top of or what he's on top of. Your Honor, Harry Rosenberg, liaison counsel for Taishan, CNBM and BNBM. Good morning, Your Honor.

THE COURT: Okay. Thank you.
MR. MILLER: Good morning, Judge. Kerry Miller. I'm

liaison counsel on the Knauf side of the manufacturers.
THE COURT: Okay. Fine. This is our monthly status conference. I met a moment ago with the lead and liaison counse1 to discuss the agenda. As you know, the agenda is prepared by meeting and conferring, and I look forward to continuing to meet and confer and talk about issues. Hopefully, the agenda can get smaller by their agreements.

Please use the microphone. We have 150 people on the phone. So they're listening and interested in what you're saying.

The agenda presented to me, pretrial orders, anything on that?

MR. LEVIN: Nothing on pretrial orders, Your Honor.
THE COURT: How about state court trial settings?
MR. LEVIN: Nothing new on state court settings, Your Honor.

THE COURT: Okay.
MR. LEVIN: State and federal coordination, the same thing, another nothing.

THE COURT: Okay.
MR. LEVIN: On the omnibus class action complaints, there's been an Omnibus 20 filed in the Eastern District of Louisiana. There's motions pending with regard to service. They've been joined. If the defendants want to file a reply brief and they so move, they will be ripe for, I guess, the

next conference for argument or at any other time that Your Honor sets them.

THE COURT: A11 right. InEX, Banner, Knauf, anything on the Global settlements?

MR. LEVIN: Nothing. Nothing on them.
THE COURT: Wait. Let's hear from Jake first.
MR. WOODY: Good morning, Your Honor.
THE COURT: Good morning, Jake.
MR. WOODY: My name is Jake Woody from BrownGreer. I do have just a very brief report on the settlement program to date.

## As I mentioned at the last few status

 conferences, we've largely converted to a payment program. Since the last status conference, we've issued $\$ 1.7 \mathrm{million}$ in payments, which brings our total to $\$ 81,005,697$. 75 percent of those payments have gone to Global, Banner, InEx claims, and 25 percent have gone to other loss claims.On the Global, Banner, InEX side, we have distributed $\$ 60,647,721$ and paid 17,655 claims. We do have $\$ 15.5$ million left across the three accounts.

We have some Global, Banner, InEX claims that we haven't paid yet either because the claimant hasn't submitted the required documentation or there's an overlap with another claim. Those numbers have dwindled to the point where I believe we have less than 100 of each.

And we continue to do outreach to claimants who need to give us documents in an attempt to get that documentation and pay them. And we also work with claimants and attorneys to resolve the overlapping claims.

On the other loss side, we've paid $\$ 20,357,976$. 28 percent of the total payments have gone to lost rent, use, and sales; 26 to pre-remediation alternative living expenses, which we abbreviate here as PRALE; 25 percent to foreclosure, short sale; 20 percent to miscellaneous; and about half a percent to bodily injury.

The lost rent, use, and sales claims are largely restricted to commercial owners, and all the other claim types are largely residential owners. So you can see that about 28 percent has gone to commercial owners, and 72 percent has gone to residential owners. That's an approximate breakdown between the two types of claims.

Just digging a little bit deeper to the other loss claims, we have determined that 5,123 are eligible, 2,777 are denied, and 27 are incomplete. The incomplete number is important because those claims are open. They still have a chance to cure that and become eligible.

For frame of reference, at the last status conference there were 140 incompletes, now we're down to 27. So, as always with these programs, that number continues to get smaller and smaller, and eventually will be zero. And total

other loss claims is 7,927 .
THE COURT: When you get to the 27 , Jake, it might be useful to get with liaison counsel and see who the lawyers are involved in those cases so that some contact can be made to the individuals. Because it may just be filling out forms or giving more information, and maybe that can help get resolve some of those.

MR. WOODY: Yes, sir. You can see that of the 27,23 are lost rent, use, and sales. What's happening here is these are mostly large condo buildings where the claim came in as one claim for the entire building and it's been sort of severed into smaller ones. And we do have time frames in which they have to respond. If they don't respond, we'11 deny the claim and close it.

THE COURT: Okay.
MR. WOODY: Just real quick1y, Your Honor. On the eligibility side, we do have 26 offers outstanding. Those are -- 18 of those are miscellaneous. Again, those are 30 days to respond to those. If there's no response, we mark it as accepted and pay them as necessary. Again, at the last status conference there were also 140 open offers and now we're down to 26.

Finally, just a quick summary of what we've done since the last status conference. We've made 555 payments totaling $\$ 1.7$ million. We have 146 other loss claims accepted,

which is important because we can pay them and close them; 483 notices issued; 128 claims denied for incompleteness, which is also significant because we can then close those claims; and 720 claims closed.

The more claims we can close, the closer we get to concluding the program. So that number is important as wel1.

THE COURT: Okay.
MR. WOODY: Al1 right.
THE COURT: Of course, this is in addition -- or it complements, I should say, the other settlement involving Knauf, which is --

MR. WOODY: Yes, sir.
THE COURT: -- a billion or something of that sort.
MR. WOODY: Yes, sir. This is just the settlement program. None of these numbers are indicative of what's going on in the remediation program. That program continues to move forward, and we do work closely with all counsel to do that.

THE COURT: Okay.
MR. WOODY: Thank you, Your Honor.
THE COURT: Okay. Thank you, Jake.
The next item is Taishan, BNBM, CNBM defendants.
Anything on that?
MR. LEVIN: There's a lot there, Your Honor.
THE COURT: Yeah.

MR. LEVIN: But it's basically, stay tuned for a November hearing and a December hearing. At liaison counsel's meeting, the Rule 12 motions are being teed up for some time, and you've asked or requested or ordered us to meet and confer with regard to scheduling.

THE COURT: Harry?
MR. ROSENBERG: Good morning, Your Honor. That's correct, Judge, that consistent with the practice of both members of the PSC and defendants' counse1, we're going to meet and confer and try to resolve all issues.

There is -- there are some motions, Your Honor, that are still outstanding, and we understand the Court's not going to expect a formal response while the parties are meeting and conferring.

THE COURT: Right. Keep me in the loop, both of you all. Maybe it might be helpful to make a list of all of those motions and let's take a look at them and see where they are so we have a meeting of the minds as to what we're doing.

MR. LEVIN: We'11 do that, sir.
MR. ROSENBERG: Your Honor, that's precisely what we were discussing, so I could meet with the counterpart at the PSC and we could have a list, and then we can establish a schedule for a hearing on those motions.

THE COURT: That's fine. Okay. Good.
MR. ROSENBERG: Thank you, Judge.

THE COURT: Yes.
Al1 right. Venture Supply, anything?
MR. LEVIN: Yes, Your Honor. The last of the Virginia settlements are ready for distribution. And the PSC has met with Mr. Serpe, and continues to meet with Mr. Serpe, who continues to advise us of the status of these claims as he processes them. And we're just waiting for Mr. Garrett to get back from his vacation to bless the final figures so that we can provide them to Your Honor and then make the distribution.

THE COURT: Okay. Anything on profile forms?
MR. LEVIN: Yes. In the omni 20 complaint, we're starting to get the profile forms. They will be delivered to defendants, Taishan liaison counsel.

THE COURT: Okay. I understand that we'11 have a motion to amend the form accordingly because you have been sending them to Kerry Miller.

MR. LEVIN: We'11 do that, Your Honor.
THE COURT: Al1 right. Let's see. With regard to the matters set for hearing following the status conference, we have four motions. Several of them are not contested. There's one that is. We weren't able to get the counsel on the phone, so we may have to take a short break and get him on the phone after this meeting.

Anything on physical evidence? Preservation
orders?

MR. LEVIN: We11, to some extent, that will be part of the November hearing with Taishan.

THE COURT: Okay. Anything else on this agenda?
MR. LEVIN: Nothing on already remediated homes -- or is there?

MR. MILLER: Yeah, briefly. Your Honor, on the issue of already remediated homes, that's item 15 on the agenda, in the past, Your Honor, we've submitted from time to time motions to the Court seeking to extinguish Knauf's obligations because of the claimant's failure to follow-up or for a number of different issues.

We filed our most recent motion I think last month, Your Honor. It's set for hearing for a regular submission date next Wednesday, October 14th. We've not received any opposition to it, but we have agreed to pull a couple of the homes off to get some more information.

So what we'11 do later on this week is submit a revised order to Eliza, and it will be unopposed like that.

THE COURT: Okay. Well, keep me posted. If it's unopposed, I'11 work it out accordingly.

MR. MILLER: Okay. We just wanted to advise the Court we're going to submit a revised order prior to the 14th and it hasn't been opposed yet.

THE COURT: Okay. Fine. All right. Thanks.
MR. LEVIN: The next is scheduled dates for --
