THE COURT: Yeah, with this report, I had one of my orders I issued was a class certification, a certified class in the certain aspect of the case against Taishan, and one of the provisions in it is to direct the parties to get to me a list of cases, as you'll see from my order, the orders, and Jake is involved with that compilation of the list.

The steering committee, under the supervision of BrownGreer, submitted an updated class plaintiffs spreadsheet endeavoring to include only the properties verified under it.

45 days. I'll let Mr. Miller speak about that as well.

THE COURT: How many cases are there still?

MR. WOODY: I believe there are 85 claims where Knauf has a claim and the homeowner also has a claim. I think all of those will be resolved in fairly short order either because of a Special Master ruling or because of a release from one of the parties. Once that is done, we can make the calculations on the remaining GBI funds and pay that out to all of the parties.

Then on the Taishan front, we did review your findings of fact and conclusions of law, and I've started to update that list to see if any of the information on it has changed since the June 2015 hearing.

We will be able to comply with that well ahead of the 60-day deadline that is in the order and come up with any new information that's available.

THE COURT: Good. Okay. Well, that sounds fine.

MR. WOODY: Thank you, Your Honor.
