### UNITED STATES DISTRICT COURT EASTERN DISTRICT OF LOUISIANA

IN THE MATTER OF FORFEITURE OF COLLATERAL IN LIEU OF APPEARANCE IN CERTAIN PETTY OFFENSE CASES

#### ORDER

Pursuant to Federal Rule of Criminal Procedure 58(d)(1) and Local Rule 58.2(A) and (B) of the Local Criminal Rules of the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Louisiana,

IT IS ORDERED that in the interests of justice, efficient court administration, and effective law enforcement concerning the petty offenses listed in Part I below, occurring within the territorial jurisdiction of the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Louisiana, the collateral in the amount prescribed in accordance with the Forfeiture of Collateral Schedule for Migratory Game Bird Hunting and National Wildlife Refuge Violations contained in Part I below may be posted in lieu of the appearance of the offender.

Upon the election of the person charged with an offense listed in Part I to post said collateral in lieu of appearance before a United States District Judge or Magistrate Judge for trial of said offense, the collateral in the amount listed below opposite the offense shall be forfeited to the United States. The posting of such collateral shall signify that the offender neither contests the charge nor requests a hearing before a United States District Judge or Magistrate Judge, and said collateral shall be administratively forfeited to the United States. If the collateral is forfeited, such action shall be tantamount to a finding of guilty.

This order containing the current list in Part I of the petty offenses and fines applicable thereto for which collateral may be accepted shall be maintained and posted in the Office of the Clerk of Court.

Therefore, pursuant to the foregoing provisions, the offenses for which collateral may be posted in lieu of the appearance of the person charged therewith are:

The above schedule of violations shall apply to first offenders. Nothing in the schedule of violations is meant to preclude the United States Attorney or other federal officer or official from exercising their discretion to file a complaint or bill of information against an alleged violator, thereby requiring personal appearance before a magistrate judge. If a person charged with an offense listed in Part I above fails to post and forfeit collateral, any punishment, including fine, imprisonment, or probation, may be imposed within the limits established by law upon conviction by plea or after trial.

#### PART II.

# MANDATORY APPEARANCE FOR UNITED STATES FISH AND WILDLIFE VIOLATIONS, EASTERN DISTRICT OF LOUISIANA

Upon the showing of the United States Attorney and the Office of Law Enforcement of the United States Department of the Interior, Fish and Wildlife Service, the Court finds that due to the severity and frequency of the below-listed violations in this District, and to facilitate law enforcement efforts and deterrence interests, no collateral forfeiture in lieu of personal appearance before the Court shall be permitted for the below-listed offenses, for which personal appearance by the alleged violator before a United States District Judge or Magistrate Judge shall be mandatory in all instances.

Therefore, the offenses for which collateral may <u>not</u> be posted in lieu of the appearance of the person charged therewith and for which personal appearance before the Court shall be mandatory are:

This Order shall constitute the Court's policies with regard to (1) collateral forfeiture without appearance and (2) those violations for which appearances before a District Judge or Magistrate Judge shall be mandatory in the listed petty offense matters and shall supplant any previous orders in that regard.
